Town Clerk

The Clerk's Office is busy with election activities and preparation. As of Friday, October 2, 2020, in 6 business days, we have received 2668 voted ballots from voters via mail and the drop box. We expect a steady flow to continue. The drop box will be available at the back entrance of Town Hall Monday-Friday, 8am-5pm through October 30th; 8am-Noon on November 2nd. The drop boxes will be moved to the polling place on election day and located outside at the entrance and exit of the gym from 7am-6pm. If Hartford Voters have not received their ballot in the mail, they should contact the Clerk's office right away to request one (802-295-2785). Voters may also choose to vote in person on Tuesday, November 3, 2020 at the Hartford High School Gym from 7am-7pm.

Planning and Development Highlights

- “Hartford Dollars” Buy Local Campaign – On Friday October 16th, following weeks of planning by the Hartford Area Chamber of Commerce, Hartford Planning & Development Department and Vital Communities, “Hartford Dollars” went on sale to stimulate spending in Hartford businesses hit hard by COVID. By Saturday evening consumers had purchased all the available \$18,000 “Dollars” at 50% face value to be spent at participating Hartford businesses over the next 6 weeks. We have received much positive feedback already. This campaign was made possible with a special state COVID grant (federal CARES funds), and the Hartford Area Chamber of Commerce volunteering to be the fiscal agent and to set up the management through its website. We are looking for additional funding to keep this going.
- Continued to attend briefings and strategy meetings on the Vermont COVID Economic Recovery Plan on state Programs announced by the state and disseminated information to businesses and organizations: Buy Local Program; Everyone Eats Sole Proprietors Grants; Landlord Tenant Rental Stabilization; expansion of state direct Economic Recovery Grants to businesses.
- Vermont Community Development Program Income from The Village at WRJ Loan-Grant Closeout documents completed, and funds received. Researched Revolving Loan Fund structure given federal HUD program beneficiary requirements. Possible second round of Hartford's Special Business Recovery Grants could come from these funds. Reviewing with Selectboard on October 20th.
- FY2021-2022 Budget – Completed 3 levels of FY 2022 proposed budget and submitted to the Town Manager and Finance Director.

- Jericho Road Private Sector Solar Project – Reviewed application to the Public Utility Commission with Planning Commission and Selectboard Chair; submitted comments separately.
- Town Forest Management Plan –The Conservation Commission will be presenting the final report to the Selectboard on November 2nd.
- Town Forest Recreation Plan – Worked with the Conservation Commission on preparation for October 21st community meeting to review the draft plan.
- Development Proposals for Public Hearings, Zoning/Building Permits – Continued to work with the state and property owner on flood plain compliance. Completed and distributed Findings of Fact for October ZBA and PC meetings.
- Continued receiving and processing information requests; requests for Zoning Permit applications; and Certificates of Occupancy.
- Town Commissions/Board/Committees– Continued to provide staff support and technical assistance to 9 Commissions/Board/Committees.
- Shelter for People Experience Homelessness – Continued to respond to inquiries about Zoning requirements in general and for specific properties.
- South Main Street TIF Improvement Projects - Continued working with DPW to support project implementation and coordination with private sector redevelopment.
- Historic Preservation Demolition Guidelines - Solicitation of consultant proposals for underway; proposal due. This is funded in part by a Certified Local Government grant and Town matching funds, approved by the SB and awarded in FY2020.
- Clifford and Radcliff Parks Resilient Hartford Survey on Use of Open Space – 171 people responded to the Resilience Hartford and Park and Rec Dept survey which concluded on October 7th. Compilation of the survey results is underway.
- Knotweed – Working with the Conservation Commission to contain the invasive knotweed plant that is adversely impacting plants native to Vermont, through controlled and limited application of herbicides consistent with state practices.
- Grant Reimbursements – Continued assembling documentation to request reimbursement of expenditures for projects receiving grant funding and other sources.
- TIF Five-Year State Audit – Continued follow-up on requests for additional information.
- Roundabout and Upper Sykes Sidewalk Project – Construction underway. Continued working with DPW.
- Website – Working with IT on updates of the Department’s webpage.
- Zoning Districts Review – Continuing review of uses in IC and HC zoning districts.
- Scanning – Continuing with scanning of department permit files.
- Climate Action Plan – Working with the CAC in collecting data and initiating an outreach plan for community participation in development of the Plan.
- Bugbee Senior Center Roof – Grant Closeout and reimbursement submitted to USDA Rural Development Agency.
- Bugbee Senior Center HVAC System – Encountered site conditions requiring a reconfiguration of the heat pump system. Completion pending receipt of materials and equipment.
- Currier Street TIF Project – With the project management support from DPW, paving and striping was completed and hand railings on order; lighting is on backorder.
- WABA Water Heater and Ice Making – Continued to assisted Parks and Rec Department on finalizing contract documents, financing and Efficient Vermont Grant.
- Police HVAC Heat Pump - Submitted agreement to receive \$1,900 incentive that covers 50% of the cost to design the system.

- Mobile Home Water Pipe Heating Solution – The Hartford Energy Commission continues to work with Vital Communities, Efficiency Vermont and the Town of Thetford to work with the University of VT Engineering Dept to develop a solution to easily and inexpensively insulate mobile home hot water pipes.
- Town Hall Ventilation Pilot Project – Submitted agreement with Efficiency VT for a \$9500 incentive towards the Flexible Load Management Pilot Project related to reducing energy consumption and costs through system programming during peak demand periods.

Parks & Recreation Department

Program Highlights

- Members of the Parks & Recreation Commission met on October 8th for its regular meeting. The Commission discussed the recent Selectboard Meeting regarding the Pool Bond. Discussion supported the Selectboard moving forward with the project and not delaying.
- The Department's weekly scavenger hunt continues. A golden ticket is discreetly hidden in one of our public parks and clues are sent virtually using Facebook and other social media outlets. All this fall be on the lookout for the Golden Ticket as it will be hidden t one of our parks and relocated each week. A close-up picture of the ticket will be posted on our Facebook page as a clue. Families who find the ticket will need to take a picture of the ticket at the park and upload it to the Facebook post or email the photo to the department. The most recent Golden Ticket was in the Hurricane Town Forest.
- Step it Up with Hartford Parks & Recreation continues to be popular during the fall season. Over the past two weeks the walks included Hartford Village, Mt. Tom, Quechee Village and the Quechee Gorge. The program is designed as a walking program which is one of the healthiest, safest and easiest ways to begin a fitness program. The group walks consist of 60 minutes of walking and has been a great way for folks to get outside, exercise and socialize with others physically distanced.
- The Hartford Parks & Recreation Lego Club continues Monday's at Town Hall following school to 5pm with 12 participants.
- Wicked Cool for Kids Stem Program is holding a Virtual Game Design 1010 with currently 4 participants. This is an afterschool program that is held virtually.
- Karen McNall's Home Décor Card Making Workshop was held on October 17th. She had 3 participants.
- Fall sport programs continues with Field Hockey, 17 participants, Flag Football 33 participants and Youth Soccer with 136 participants. The program will continue through the month of October.
- Fall Pickleball continues at Maxfield on the Pickleball Courts every Tuesday and Thursday from 6pm to 7:30pm. This is a drop-in program. A group of 15 to 18 participants attend the program.
- A new session of Youth Karate started on October 14th with 9 participants from 5pm to 6pm on Monday and Wednesday.
- The Department is pushing out information on a new program to be offered on November 3rd during a no school day. The program is called No School Fund Day with HPRD.
- The Department is planning for our Trunk or Treat Halloween event. The Department is working with local businesses, organizations, groups, families, or individuals to participate as an exhibitor, donate pre-packaged candy/goodies or a monetary donation to help support the free event. This year's Trunk-or-Treat will be a drive-thru style event, held at the HHS campus. We will line the campus parking lot with Halloween Decorators. Each exhibitor will be provided with an approximately space of 10'x10' for their family friendly display.

Exhibitors will not pass out candy/goodies to participants at their decorated trunk area. The Parks & Rec Staff will hand out one large Halloween goodie bag to each trick-or-treater at the end of the displays. Participants/Spectators will slowly drive through and enjoy viewing the exhibits from their vehicles. We are seeking donations of pre-packaged candy or Halloween goodies to make up the Halloween treat bags for the children. Participating businesses and organizations are welcome to provide their business cards, stickers, etc. for the treat bags. We are planning to make up 1,000 bags for the event. Donated Items will need to be received by the HPRD by Monday, October 26th. Additional information will be sent out a few days prior to the event.

Parks/Facilities

- The Parks & Recreation Commission held a park and facility tour on October 15th from 5pm to about 7pm. The members toured the Wendell A. Barwood Arena where the tour included the new COVID Guidelines for entry and exiting the facility. Additionally, we toured the refrigeration plant and got a sneak peek at the new installation of bleachers. The Commission also toured Frost Park in Wilder and Kilowatt North and Kilowatt South.
- WABA Arena officially had its soft opening on Sunday, October 18th with a few group rentals and public skating. Staff spent a majority of the past two weeks preparing the facility to be opened. Cleaning and sprucing up the facility along with staff training and building the ice surface. Painting of the ice and installation of the center logo took place on October 12th.
- The arena operations include the implementation of the COVID-19 Operating Guidelines. The guidelines include protocols on arriving and departing the facility. Additional time is added between user groups to eliminate contact exposure between groups and we have implemented a 10-minute rule. Groups will not be able to enter until 10 minutes prior to scheduled ice time and must depart within 10 minutes after getting off the ice. A rotation between use of the east and west end of the facility also helps keep the program time slots on schedule. The Secretary of the Agency of Commerce, Lindsay Kurrle noted that the Hartford WABA Arena COVID Operations Guidelines is a very strong plan and was identified as the “Gold Star” for showing other rink operations how to develop an operations plan for rinks.
- The Department created a short video for users of the facility to view. The video reviews the guidelines for entering and exiting the facility. The video link was sent to user groups and posted on our social media sites.
- The Park Facilities had a total of 28 reservations over the past two weeks. The Department has issued nearly 100 Park Permits for this year. Park usage during COVID has increased dramatically.
- The REALice system and the new heat pump water heater was installed on October 15th and 16th. The systems are operational, and we look forward to the benefits of saving energy costs.
- The bleacher project started. This included the removal of the old system and installation of new. The bleacher installation is going well, with about half the system installed already.
- All other routine operations continue within the parks system. Mowing and string trimming has slowed down some with the cooler weather. This time of year, is extremely busy as we try to close the parks for the season and at the same time opening the ice arena

32. The contractor for the Sykes Mountain Projects is busy completing the subsurface and utility work on Route 5 and Sykes Mountain Avenue.
33. Hannah reviewed preliminary plans for the VA Cutoff Bridge Project with that design team. They will be joining us at the October 20th board meeting to present a project update.
34. Hannah, Jeremy, and Brittney continue to work closely with Paula Nulty to complete our hiring processes.
35. Chris continues to work closely with our consultant to address the failing 5E leach field in Quechee. It is likely that they will require us to address infiltration issues within that portion of the system as part of the new permit.
36. The DPW team has been working with appropriate town staff regarding a series of alleged violations on Hathaway Road, Dothan Road, Quechee Main Street, Verna Court, and South Main Street. The investigations and follow up work on these issues take a substantial amount of staff time, however be assured that we make all efforts to work in the best interest of the community to have the violations resolved in a timely manner.
37. We were recently notified by the project team on the Colodny Building that they are trying to re-mobilize to the jobsite to finish the project. DPW staff is reviewing their request and will likely be issuing a permit early this week.
38. At this time the contractor for South Main Street Project team has completed the retaining wall work and nearly all of the waterline work.
39. The Currier Street Project is nearly complete – just a few finishing touches to check that project off the list.
40. It seems like a very busy time of year for private construction and real estate changes! Chris has been working closely with developers and individuals on a variety of projects to ensure compliance with standards and assist them in navigating permitting processes.
41. The designer for the South Main Parking Lot is currently performing value engineering to determine a balance between raising the grade of the parking lot and the size of the retaining wall that will be needed.

Administrative Ongoing

These are projects or tasks that may not have substantial current updates, but worth noting that they exist in the background of our daily operations.

42. We are working with Dillon Walsh to repair issues with our phone system. We are experiencing ‘dropped calls’ on a regular basis and that our voicemail boxes are full, when they aren’t. Please be patient while we work to correct this.
43. The April 15th, 2019 rain event has been federally declared as a disaster. Jeremy has been working with FEMA on this project. Although FEMA notified us recently that due to the classification of this road as a Federal Aid Route (thus not qualified for FEMA funding), there are State of Vermont funds allocated for repairs to these streets.
44. Jeremy Delisle continues to work with FEMA and Vermont Emergency Management to close out the July 1st (2017) storm. It looks like we are getting closer!
45. DPW staff continues to work closely with several private contractors around town to ensure that their projects are in permit compliance (Wilder School, Sykes Mountain Avenue dealerships, Currier Street, Twin Pines, the Simpson Development, and 132 South Main). Chris Holzwarth has been working very closely with the Planning and

Zoning Department and the project team from 132 South Main to keep that project moving forward.

46. Recently, the Norwich School District requested that we continue to work with them to develop an MOU for exploring the possibility of a sewer connection. At this time, we continue to remind them that the work to complete the State mandated CSO study ultimately takes precedence and may render the connection an impossibility.
47. Paula Nulty continues to provide us with support on a variety of human resources items. We appreciate all of her assistance.
48. DPW staff is working to ensure that our permitting process (various items) are issued and reviewed consistently.
49. We have recently been getting a lot of inquiries for repairs to driveway culverts. There are intricacies around the responsibility and ownership of them and we are working with the VLCT to clearly define them so we can respond appropriately and consistently.
50. Hannah is closing out the West Hartford Library Project (leftover from TS Irene). She continues to field Requests for Information from FEMA and Vermont Emergency Management.
51. Recently, Casella contacted the Town with an offer to take over the operation of the SW facility in a long term (20 year) memorandum of understanding (MOU). At this time, Casella has requested that the town consider the offer and enter into non-binding, good faith negotiations. Although the current offer is zero sum, this has the potential to relieve the Town from being in the Solid Waste business at a facility that requires substantial capital improvements to continue operation.
52. A consultant has been hired to complete the Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasure Plan required by the EPA for the Solid Waste facility.
53. Unfortunately, we are struggling with disposal of our solid sludge that is accumulated from both the Quechee and White River facilities. Historically we have been able to dispose of that waste at the Lebanon Solid Waste facility, however, they aren't able to accept our sludge at the rate we accumulate it due to the restrictions on their composition. We are very actively investigating other options and seeking quotes from our water resources engineers so that we can develop a menu of options for disposal or better processing.
54. DPW staff is working closely with the State and our consultant to complete the required PFAS testing on the fields which we have formerly land applied. This is an unanticipated, costly expense to our budget.
55. Although the design and permitting phase of the Quechee Main Box Culvert is completed, that project was put on hold until next year due to the Quechee Balloon Festival's re-schedule. Unfortunately, it looks like that event has been cancelled for this year. Do to the scale of work there, it is too late for us to issue the bids and complete the project within the in-stream work permitting requirements.
56. The engineering plans for the proposed 12" ductile iron water main in Quechee Main Street are currently at 50%. We are currently evaluating hydrant placements which could be used for tanker filling and as temporary water connections during scheduled shut downs for culvert replacements or disasters. These placements are complicated by topography and other restrictions making a careful evaluation that weighs their value critical. With Covid-19 restrictions and potential financial complications the project

schedule has been extended with engineering/permitting to be completed by December 2021 and potential construction moved to summer/fall 2021.

57. The engineering plans for the proposed utility improvements in Abbey Road are complete and no State permits are required. We are currently waiting on the Town attorney to complete easements for the work which has been delayed due to Covid-19 restrictions. The engineer's projected cost is currently \$225,000, which is far greater than originally anticipated. With financial complications the project schedule has been extended with easement work to be completed by December 2020 potential construction moved to summer/fall 2021. We will be working with the State to determine financing options in the coming months. Town crews will continue to monitor and clean the sewer on a regular basis to prevent back-ups.
58. The engineering plans for the proposed water main improvements in South and James Streets were completed with revisions under way to address State review comments. We expect to receive an engineer's estimate of cost once the revisions are complete. We anticipate construction in the summer/fall 2021. We will be working to determine the funding source once we have an estimate of cost.

Note: The operations and project updates outlined in this memorandum are an overview of our operations and not exclusive to any individual projects.

Police

Please find the police department's significant policing activities for the week ending October 18th, when the police department recorded 301 activities – including 50 directed vehicle or foot patrols and 5 bike patrols.

October 12th -15th – Technicians from the Vermont Enhanced 911 Board completed the installation and activation of new next generation INdigital mapping, voice and text controls to 911 consoles in the Emergency Communications Center and other 911 Centers in the state.

October 15th-16th – Hartford Police Detectives worked with federal, state and local investigators throughout New England to locate a White River Junction woman reported as missing.

October 14th-19th – Hartford Police continued their investigation into resident complaints regarding what appeared to be hand to hand drug transactions, open drug use and similar activity occurring at or near two residences along Fairview Terrace in White River Junction, investigators served four search and seizure warrants this past week, recovering over 300 bags of heroin and quantities of methamphetamine. Five adults were arrested for possession and/or trafficking of heroin. This investigation is continuing.
