

Significant Activity Report

December 29, 2020

Department of Public Works

Highway

1. The Highway Crew wants to send a big thank you to all DPW staff for working together on the major snowstorm.
2. The Highway Crew started plowing roads at 2:30am on December 17th, and worked straight through to 10:30pm.
3. The Highway Crew returned at 4:00am on December 18th to continue cleaning up their routes and pushing back snowbanks. All roads were open by the end of the day.
4. The Highway Crew reported to work at midnight on December 20th to remove snow from the downtown area throughout the night.
5. Made sure sidewalks were opened on December 21st.
6. Spent December 23rd and 24th preparing and checking all gravel roads for incoming rain storm.
7. The rain and snow melt this past weekend led to washouts and minor damage on our gravel roads. Crews are focused on getting those repaired.

Water

8. **It is our goal to take all necessary steps to maintain the health and safety of our employees and community. Until further notice, we will not be entering any homes unless we are notified of a water leak causing home damage.**
9. The Water Department continues to work with a smaller crew due to Covid quarantine requirements and vacations.
10. Completed monthly edits.
11. Assisted the Highway Department with plowing and sanding.
12. Cleared snow from hydrants.

Wastewater

13. **It is our goal to take all necessary steps to maintain the health and safety of our employees and community. Until further notice, we will not be entering any homes unless we are notified of a wastewater leak causing home damage.**
14. The White River Wastewater Crew has been actively working on the following:
 - a. Station work has been scheduled for January 6th and 7th. A new pump will be installed at Bridge Street and a valve will be replaced at Maple Street.
 - b. Ordered a new oxygen sensor.
 - c. Ordered a new hose for the Jetter.
 - d. Was called out to Hitchcock Drive, discovered a plugged main sewer line.
 - e. One of our heating boilers was serviced, still waiting on parts for repair.
15. The Quechee Wastewater Crew has been actively working on the following:
 - a. The Quechee Wastewater Crew received quotes from Champlin to wire in a new chemical pump.
 - b. Contacted U.V newspaper about wastewater operator duties.
 - c. Had metal locators repaired.
 - d. Tried contacting contractor again about heating system repair or replacement. We have not had any luck yet.
 - e. Repaired a chemical line to the basin.

Fleet Management

16. Fleet Management performed the following:

17. PD-1 serviced RF axle shaft assembly, transmission seal, and both outer tie rod ends.
18. PD-2 experiencing wiper issues.
19. PD-10 completed tire repairs.
20. AMB-3 experiencing Opticom issues.
21. Eng-4 repaired charging system and repaired wiring to voltage regulator.
22. 928 system and hydraulic valve repairs completed.
23. H-6 installed drive tires.
24. H-3 replaced wing window and track.
25. H-2 replaced leaking transmission cooler lines.
26. New PTO shaft for the Trackless made and installed. Repaired main drive line flange.
27. H-7 repaired air intake grille, replaced alternator and fan belts along with tensioners.
28. Started repairs on the Tenco Blower hydraulic valve.
29. H-10 repaired sander and hoist leak.

Solid Waste

30. On December 26, 2020, Wanda Stockman retired from the Solid Waste team. We are grateful for her many years of service and wish her well in her next adventures!
31. Hannah is working closely with the State to finalize our annual SWIP.
32. Hannah, Brittney, Gail, Flo, and Dawna have spent a significant amount of time ironing out billing issues with the City of Lebanon for tipping fees and wastewater grit disposal.
33. A huge thank you to Brittney for learning some of the essential duties at Solid Waste until we have all of our vacancies there filled.

Administrative Active

34. The DPW team continues remain responsive to changes related to Covid-19.
35. The DPW team has dedicated substantial amounts of time to the budgeting process.
36. Brittney continues to utilize our Facebook page! We are excited to be able to share information to our community. Please continue to check there for good news and DPW updates.
37. The Sykes Mountain Project is currently 'shut down' for the winter. We anticipate re-starting up in April.
38. The DPW team continues to work with VTrans as the VA Cutoff Bridge Replacement design phase moves forward.
39. The DPW team continues to work with VTrans as the Route 14 Paving Project moves forward. That project is anticipated to kick off in Spring 2021.
40. We continue to work together to fill vacancies in the department.
41. Chris continues to work closely with our consultant to address the failing 5E leach field in Quechee. It is likely that they will require us to address infiltration issues within that portion of the system as part of the new permit.
42. It seems like a very busy time of year for private construction and real estate changes! Chris has been working closely with developers and individuals on a variety of projects to ensure compliance with standards and assist them in navigating permitting processes.
43. Chris and the Wastewater Team are working with Aldrich and Elliot to do smoke testing of portions of the sewer system as part of our LTCP/CSO study continues.
44. DPW staff continues to support the team at the Colodny Building project.
45. Chris is working closely with Aldrich and Elliot and Lori as we move forward with the second phase of the South Main Street project.
46. It appears that the work around the Union negotiations is moving forward.
47. The contractor on South Main Street project has demobilized for the winter. They will likely be back in April.
48. Hannah prepared a memorandum for John regarding Fairview Terrace – current status and future plans.

Administrative Ongoing

These are projects or tasks that may not have substantial current updates, but worth noting that they exist in the background of our daily operations.

49. We are working with Dillon Walsh to repair issues with our phone system. We are experiencing 'dropped calls' on a regular basis and that our voicemail boxes are full, when they aren't. Please be patient while we work to correct this.
50. The April 15th, 2019 rain event has been federally declared as a disaster. Jeremy has been working with FEMA on this project. Although FEMA notified us recently that due to the classification of this road as a Federal Aid Route (thus not qualified for FEMA funding), there are State of Vermont funds allocated for repairs to these streets.
51. Jeremy Delisle continues to work with FEMA and Vermont Emergency Management to close out the July 1st (2017) storm. It looks like we are getting closer!
52. DPW staff continues to work closely with several private contractors around town to ensure that their projects are in permit compliance (Wilder School, Sykes Mountain Avenue dealerships, Currier Street, Twin Pines, the Simpson Development, and 132 South Main). Chris Holzwarth has been working very closely with the Planning and Zoning Department and the project team from 132 South Main to keep that project moving forward.
53. The Norwich School District continues to make inquiries regarding the possibility for a connection to our wastewater system to resolve the failing system at the Marion Cross School.
54. Paula Nulty continues to provide us with support on a variety of human resources items. We appreciate all of her assistance.
55. DPW staff is working to ensure that our permitting process (various items) are issued and reviewed consistently.
56. Hannah is closing out the West Hartford Library Project (leftover from TS Irene). She continues to field Requests for Information from FEMA and Vermont Emergency Management.
57. A consultant has been hired to complete the Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasure Plan required by the EPA for the Solid Waste facility.
58. Unfortunately, we are struggling with disposal of our solid sludge that is accumulated from both the Quechee and White River facilities. Historically we have been able to dispose of that waste at the Lebanon Solid Waste facility, however, they aren't able to accept our sludge at the rate we accumulate it due to the restrictions on their composition. We are very actively investigating other options and seeking quotes from our water resources engineers so that we can develop a menu of options for disposal or better processing.
59. DPW staff is working closely with the State and our consultant to complete the required PFAS testing on the fields which we have formerly land applied. This is an unanticipated, costly expense to our budget.
60. Although the design and permitting phase of the Quechee Main Box Culvert is completed, that project was put on hold until next year due to the Quechee Balloon Festival's re-schedule. Unfortunately, it looks like that event has been cancelled for this year. Do to the scale of work there, it is too late for us to issue the bids and complete the project within the in-stream work permitting requirements.
61. The engineering plans for the proposed 12" ductile iron water main in Quechee Main Street are currently at 50%. We are currently evaluating hydrant placements which could be used for tanker filling and as temporary water connections during scheduled shut downs for culvert replacements or disasters. These placements are complicated by topography and other restrictions making a careful evaluation that weighs their value critical. With Covid-19 restrictions and potential financial complications the project schedule has been extended with engineering/permitting to be completed by December 2021 and potential construction moved to summer/fall 2021.
62. The engineering plans for the proposed utility improvements in Abbey Road are complete and no State permits are required. We are currently waiting on the Town attorney to complete easements for the work which has been delayed due to Covid-19 restrictions. The engineer's projected cost is currently \$225,000, which is far greater than originally anticipated. With financial complications the project schedule has been extended with easement work to be completed by December 2020 potential construction moved to summer/fall 2021. We will be working with the State to determine financing options in the coming months. Town crews will continue to monitor and clean the sewer on a regular basis to prevent back-ups.
63. The engineering plans for the proposed water main improvements in South and James Streets were completed with revisions under way to address State review comments. We expect to receive an engineer's estimate of cost once the revisions are complete. We anticipate construction in the summer/fall 2021. We will be working to determine the funding source once we have an estimate of cost.

Parks & Recreation Department

Program Highlights

- Hartford Parks & Recreation completed our Light Up Hartford activity which included 65 participants. Staff and volunteers traveled around the community on Wednesday, December 16th to judge the event. Community members registered for the location map at Hartfordrec.com. The map plotted the 65 locations throughout the community and a separate document located the addresses within each village. The Department secured several prizes from local retailers to support the event. Funkalicious Deli, Home Depot, Walmart, Zuzu's, Dan & Whit's, Diane's Casual Cuts, Coop Foodstore, WYZE.
- The winners for the Light Up Hartford, Coloring Contest, Happy HOWlidays Pet Photo Contest were officially announced. Karen McNall did a fantastic job marketing the community-based programs and created individual videos for the Light Up Hartford and Happy HOWlidays Pet Photo Contest. - The After-School Lego Club continues Monday's after school and will begin again following the holiday break. Virtual programs continue as well. Kids Collage Art, Deep Blue Sea and Improv Comedy.
- The Department's In-The-House Skate continued at WABA. The new program at WABA follows the COVID Guidance that was set by the Governor's Office when youth sports was paused. In-The-House Skate started the week of December 8th and will currently continue through the month of December. Four sessions will be held each Wednesday through Saturday for households in Vermont to register for a one-hour timeslot. Registered participants for each timeslot must be from the same household.
- A permit was issued to Elisabeth Cadle for a Winter Solstice Labyrinth at Lyman Point Park through January 1st.
- Marketing of upcoming programs included: Youth Karate, Nihon Aikijujutsu and Kids Crafternoon. Both programs have strong enrollment and additional registrations were added.
- Lighting Soccer has submitted two park permits for 2021. Spring Soccer at Clifford and their annual soccer camp in July at Maxfield.
- The Department submitted our Annual Report to the Town Manager's Office to be included in the Town Report.

Parks/Facilities

- Department continues to work on the Bond Bank Application for the Municipal Pool Project.
- Additional virtual meetings have taken place with Breadloaf Construction regarding information needed. We are working on a site survey and a few additional borings in the pool area. Both items are part of the Preliminary Design funding through the LOT funds and is not part of the Breadloaf proposal. The work was anticipated, and the scope was developed after the project was approved by the Selectboard to move forward.
- Parks Staff spent time cutting back and removing a large patch of sumac at Kilowatt South. The area had become overgrown.
- The path between Kilowatt North and South was flail mowed to widen out the overgrowth of the pathway between the two parks.
- Stormwater catchment basins at Maxfield were maintained using the flail mower. The basin areas are required to be maintained annually as part of the stormwater permit for the park.
- Parks Staff completed closure of the parks prior to the most recent snowstorm. Closure includes closure of the gates.
- New signs were posted at Kilowatt North and South along with Maxfield to aid in educating the park users of the dog leash law. Signs were posted to remind users of the parks that leash laws exist, and you must have your dog on a leash unless they are visiting the Watson Dog Park, or they are within the Off Leash Zone at Kilowatt South and Hurricane Wildlife Refuge Park in the Town Forest. All other park areas require dogs to be on a leash.
- The electrical doors that cover the electrical panel at Lyman Point Bandstand were damaged and repaired.
- ARC mechanical completed a compressor replacement for one of the old dehumidifier units.
- WABA Arena will re-open under the updated guidance within Governor Scott's COVID-19 Executive Orders. The new order takes the youth sports out of pause mode and allows us to begin youth sport and high school practices and clinics. League games or scrimmages are not allowed at this time and we are limited to 25 participants on the ice. This is good news for the WABA operations.

Department of Planning and Development Highlights

Period Ending December 26, 2020

- “Hartford Dollars” COVID Buy Local Program – The numbers are in from round 1:
 - 47 businesses registered.
 - 154 people purchased the available \$18,000 worth of Hartford Dollars in less than 48 hours of the program’s launch.
 - 31 businesses had customers use Hartford Dollars - totals ranging from \$3540 to \$30 at these businesses.Thanks to a generous donation to the Hartford Area Chamber of Commerce, another round of Hartford Dollars will be possible. More details in January.
- Vermont COVID Economic Recovery Plan on State Programs- Continued to push out information on additional assistance programs as nearing the December 31, 2020 deadline to spend federal CARES funding.
- TIF Five-Year State Audit – Received draft State Auditor’s report and provided comments for Town Manager’s approval. Submitted comments on December 21st. Anticipate final report from the state in January.
- Vermont Community Development Program Income-New Revolving Loan Fund - Developing procedures for collecting income beneficiary information.
- FY2021-2022 Budget – Continued to respond to requests for additional information.
- Hartford Business Revolving Loan Fund (HBRLF) –Following Selectboard approval of additional COVID grants on December 15th, checks were mailed to the 24 businesses.
- Town Forest Recreation Plan – Staff and the Conservation Commission reviewed revisions to the Plan based on public comments.
- Climate Action Plan – Continued working with the CAC to collect data for the analysis of existing conditions in the development of the Plan. Responded to Committee questions regarding FY 2020 funding proposal for Selectboard consideration.
- Zoning Districts Review – The Planning Commission will be having two community meetings in January to discuss the possibility of creating two new zoning districts that add residential and mixed-use as Conditional Use to a section of the Industrial-Commercial District along RT 5, and to a section of the Highway Commercial District in Quechee along RT 4.
- Bond Bank Application – Submitted the Bond Bank application for the Pool project and the Town Square Parking Lot and Maple Street 2020 voter approved TIF projects. Followed-up on questions.
- Annual Town Report – Completed various submittals for the Town Report and followed-up with various Town Commissions for their submittals.
- VT Downtown Program - Began assembling information for the 2020 report due to the state at the end of January.
- Development Proposals/Building Permit Applications – Continued receiving and processing information requests, Zoning Permit applications, and Certificates of Occupancy. Responded to various development inquiries and review of preliminary information.
- Workforce Housing – Working with Evernorth (formerly Housing Vermont) on identifying opportunities to develop workforce housing in Hartford.
- TIF Annual Report – Continued assembling information for the FY 2020 report due to the state in January.
- Vermont Community Development Program (VCDP) Cornerstone Community Center (CCC) Planning Grant Application – Given the grant application was not approved due to more requests than available funds, CCC discussion other options for funding with Town and State staff.
- VCDP Wentworth Housing Grant – Continuing to work with the state, Twin Pines Housing Trust and and Evernorth (formerly Housing Vermont) to execute grant agreement and subgrant agreements.
- Town Commissions/Board/Committees– Continued to provide staff support and technical assistance to 9 Commissions/Board/Committees.
- South Main Street TIF Improvement Projects –Working with DPW on engineering and design on second phase for construction in 2021.

- Town Forest Tree Harvesting – Continuing to work with the state Forester to develop a tree harvesting plan for 2021.
- Historic Preservation Demolition Standards RFP – Staff and Historic Preservation Commission reviewing submitted proposal.
- Clifford Park Resilient Hartford Use of Open Space – Staff is working with the Resilience Hartford Committee to map out a process to use Clifford Park for food production.
- Town COVID Committee –Continued circulating information provided by the committee.
- Grant Reimbursements – Continued assembling documentation to request reimbursement of expenditures for projects receiving grant funding and other sources.
- Mobile Home Water Pipe Heating Solution – The Hartford Energy Commission continues to work with Vital Communities, Efficiency Vermont and the Town of Thetford to work with the University of VT Engineering Dept to develop a solution to easily and inexpensively insulate mobile home hot water pipes.
- Hartford Energy Commission Monthly Newsletter – HEC is restarting its monthly newsletter in January. Look for the link on the Town Website and social media.
- Vermont Annual Statewide Energy Conference – Three HEC members gathered virtually with hundreds of people around the state to learn and share information in a multi-day virtual conference in mid-December. More information to come on this in the monthly newsletter.
